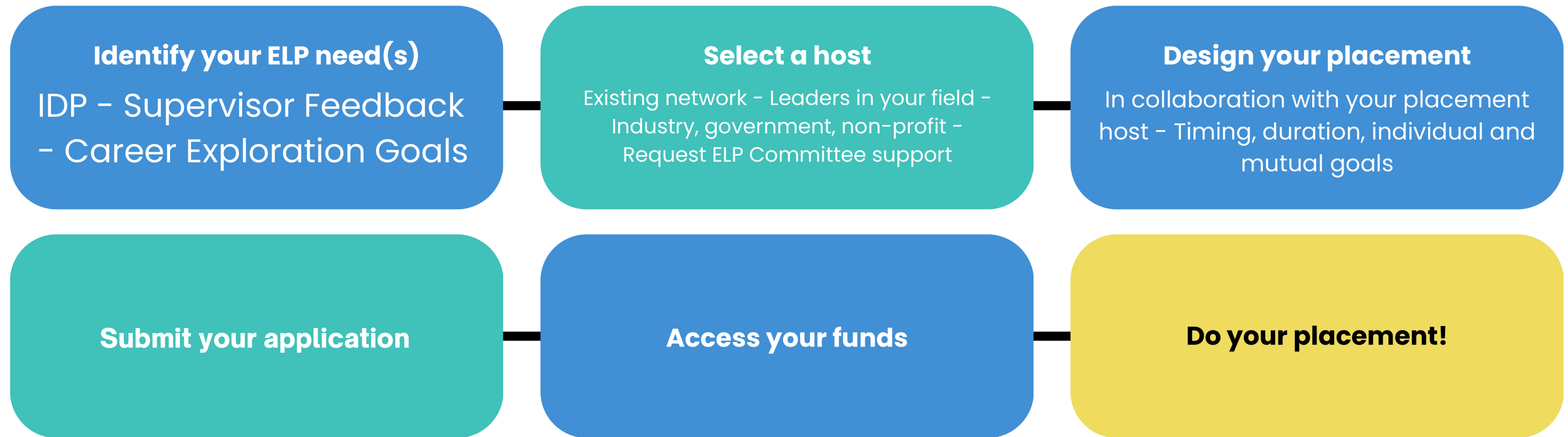

APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

- Placement date(s) and location(s), including contact information for host faculty/organization(s)
- What you hope to learn during your placement and your plan for learning it
- What it will contribute to your current research project and/or future career, with an emphasis on impact
- How you will share your learning with other researchers and/or members of the TRIANGLE community when you return
- How your visit will contribute to the knowledge and/or research and/or work of the host faculty/organization
- Basic budget—flight and accommodation costs, other transport, food, etc.

REVIEW & EVALUATION PROCESS

Submit application



Submit your ELP application to the ELP committee

Application reviewed & approved



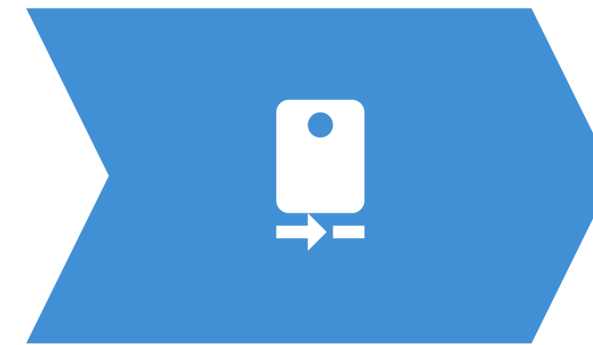
The committee reviews and either approves or sends back for revision before approval

Submit mid-term reflection



Complete a mid-term reflection on how your placement is going

Awardee post-placement evaluation



At the end of the year, reflect on and evaluate what you learned and how you're using it

Supervisor and host post-placement evaluation



At the end of the year, your PI and your placement host will share their assessment of the placement
